Guide dogs and hearing dogs are welcome. If you wish to take your dog with you, please ask the Stewards for directions to suitable seats on the aisle. British Sign Language interpreters from Signs of God will be present at all plenary sessions. A TA loop system is in operation within the Auditorium.
