## Churches to champion voter registration

As a General Election approaches, a new initiative has been launched that will equip local churches to increase democratic participation through registering people to vote, providing information about the need to have appropriate photo ID, and encouraging people to vote on polling day. The Baptist Union of GB has been announced as one of the ambassadors for the **Voter Registration Champions** initiative set up by Citizens UK.

Our Joint Public Issues Team has some helpful information about it - including a podcast 'Ten minutes on... voter registration'.

The Electoral Commission has warned that 8 million eligible voters may not vote at the next General Election because they don't register to vote in time; 4 million eligible voters may not vote because they do not have appropriate Photo ID; and 14 million eligible voters may not vote because they are not motivated to turn out to vote on election day. This lack of participation is skewed – you are at greater risk of not being able to participate in the democratic process if you are: young, a non-UK national, rent your home, have moved recently, live in an economically-disadvantaged community, or are from an ethnic minority.

The Voter Registration Champions scheme has been set up to engage groups to address this, and encourage democratic participation, in a non-partisan way. Local churches are encouraged to sign up, as a way of helping to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to participate and be heard in the democratic process. Champions will be provided with free support and resources to help them enrol voters. Please consider whether your church could sign up.



## **Baptist Assembly 2024**

'When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place!'

Baptist Assembly 2024 is over Pentecost weekend and will be a wonderful opportunity to be filled afresh with the gift of the Holy Spirit. We will dwell on the words of Acts 2 throughout and prayer will be central. Friends from across the Baptist family will be joining us for what is hoped to be a genuine, contemporary Pentecost for Baptists Together. Project Violet is a three-year participatory research project that is examining the place of women in Baptist ministry. The aim of the project has been to understand more fully the theological, missional, and structural obstacles women ministers face in the Baptist community in England and Wales and identify ways forward. ## **Resurrection People from Engage Worship**

Engage Worship offers a new resource for churches to use after Easter. Resurrection People has a **Church Service Pack** outlining seven services. It is accompanied by a **Personal Devotions book**, with five readings per week allowing congregations to carry on the journey throughout the week, going deeper into the themes. ## **Hosting a Hustings**

Whilst we do not have a date for the next General Election, we know that one will be called this year. During the period before a General Election, churches and community organisations often organise election meetings (sometimes known as hustings) where members of the public can listen to and ask questions of the candidates who are standing for election. They do this as a public service, to support the democratic process, to facilitate public debate and as a contribution to the common good. This opportunity for respectful discussion in a neutral space is often appreciated by candidates as well as voters.


#### 'Your Faith, Your Online World'


## **UK Church Administrators Network (UCAN)**


## Christian charity launches new Little Book of Joy
