Project Violet is a three-year participatory research project that is examining the place of women in Baptist ministry. Key messages from our Core Leadership Team





Hosting a Hustings

Whilst we do not have a date for the next General Election, we know that one will be called this year. During the period before a General Election, churches and community organisations often organise election meetings (sometimes known as hustings) where members of the public can listen to and ask questions of the candidates who are standing for election. They do this as a public service, to support the democratic process, to facilitate public debate and as a contribution to the common good. This opportunity for respectful discussion in a neutral space is often appreciated by candidates as well as voters. 




Baptist Assembly - 17-19 May
